- Each group requires different treatment
- Treating them correctly helps the church to grow.

- Thessalonians were losing hope because of lost brethren
- We are to comfort these no matter the cause

Uphold the weak

• Rom 5:6

"For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly."

- Weak = spiritually immature
- Support the weak in understanding
- Christ did for all of us

"with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love"

- Can be discouraging when brethren grow slower than we would like
- Key word: love

- Our job description
- Must patiently teach

- Help each other abide by vs. 14
- Continuation of patience

 Some could miraculously discern the spirits

"Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world. By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God"

- Prophecies could be tested without miraculous spiritual gifts
- True prophecies would never contradict past teaching

"These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so."

- We also hear teaching from men
- We are just as responsible for testing their teaching.
- Do not despise the teaching just because a man delivered it

A congregation will always grow closer to God if they have the right attitude toward the Spirit
