I. Characteristics Of The Tongue

1: highest calling of Jewish child

- James is not against prepared teachers
 - 1. Acts 15:24, introduced error
 - 2. Ro.2:17-29, teaching \neq life
 - 3. 1 Tim.1:6-7; 2 Tim.3:7
 - 4. 2 Tim.4:3, tickled

2: our most frequent failures: speech

- If not, then we are perfect (mature)
- Ja.1:19
- The tongue is the last part of the body to get under control.
- Mk.3:5
- Ac.24:9, And the Jews also assented,
 maintaining that these things were so.

3-4: James, with illustrations

- 'There is more imagery drawn from natural phenomena in the one short epistle of James than in all of Paul's epistles put together.'
 - 1000 lb. horse bit
 - Huge ship rudder
 - Hitler, Stalin, S. Hussein
 - Tongue

5-6: tongue – powerful

- Powerful for good
- If misused, like spark in forest

Source of tongue spark: hell!

One angry word can destroy relationship of a lifetime

7-8: cannot be tamed

- Tongue can be silenced by . . .
 - 1. Paralysis
 - 2. Excision
 - 3. Death
 - 4. Grace of God
- Ps.140:3.
