Matthew 27

Judas is unique in this narrative

- 1. Disciples would never forsake Him
- 2. Peter would not deny Him
- 3. Jews would use false witnesses to stop Him; He was resurrected
- 4. Pilate would release Him
- 5. Herod would see His miracles
- 6. People would enjoy the show, Lk.23
- 7. Judas alone failed by succeeding

Many think they want something until they get it

- 1. Gn.13, Lot, fertile land; 19, bad company
- 2. Gn.37, Joseph's brothers, revenge
- 3. 2 Sm.13, Amnon and Tamar, lust

Why could Peter be forgiven for denying, Judas not for betraying? Repentance

- Peter turned to Lord, Mt.26:75
- Judas turned to suicide
 - Regret: wishes something could be undone. 2 Co.7:8
 - Like Cain, Judas sought relief in wrong way.

Why could Peter be forgiven for denying, Judas not for betraying? Repentance

- Peter turned to Lord, Mt.26:75
- Judas turned to suicide
 - Repentance: change of mind
 - Filled with Godly Sorrow
 - NT: always change based on God, 2 Co.7:8-10

Many never learn true meaning of repentance Adultery:

- May regret state, but will not change
- "Does this mean they can't be saved?"
- 2 Co.12:21

 - Ep.5:25, 28; 6:4
- Mt.13:22, deceitfulness of riches (promise happiness; Judas got woe)
- 1 Tim.6:10

Judas would love to appease his conscience . . . How?

- By recalling Jesus' sins and hypocrisy – 'kiss and tell'
- Men who rejected Christ did so in spite of evidence to contrary –
 - Mt.12:22...38
 - Jn.11:47-53; 12:9-11

Did Judas think returning money would atone for sin (1)?

Our deeds have eternal consequences. Ec.8:11

Immorality – lose innocence...

Marriage – stuck!

Painful words – cannot unsay...

Suicide (v.5) – 2 Sm.17:23

No one enjoyed greater blessings or privileges than Judas

- Heard greatest teacher EVER, Mt.7
- Saw greatest example <u>EVER</u>, Mt.3,4...
- Saw / experienced greatest miracles EVER, Mk.1:32...
- Received greatest favors EVER, Mk.3:19
- Received greatest warning EVER,
 Mt.26:21, 24; personally identified, v.25

In spite of his advantages, Judas was covetous

Jn.12:6; 13:2; Mt.26 [Gn.3]

- Judas fed his weakness, yielded to it...
- Peter fought his weakness, fell, but kept getting up

The benefit to us –

- 1. Count it all joy when someone reveals your faults to you. Ph.3:12-14
- 2. At first symptom of disease, seek the cure.
- 3. We are not unique. 1 Co.10:13.
