Issue: church donations to institutions to do the work of the church

- Before 1849 . . .
 - United brotherhood
 - Preached gospel; saved many
 - Some wanted to imitate denominations – organized ACMS
 - Fewer were taught gospel
 - Paved way for more apostasy

History repeats

• Before 1950 . . .

- Most churches opposed M. Society
- Preached gospel; saved many.
- Few understood why they opposed M. Society.
- Duplicated society in benevolence
 - 1938: G. C. Brewer schools
 - 1963: B. B. Baxter schools



- 4. Systematic arrangement


ISSUE: May churches build / maintain Benevolent Society to do their work of benevolence.



1. "NT does not tell us HOW"

- Baxter: "go"
- Confuses method and organization
- Churches donate to Missionary Society [board]; board decides 'how'

To justify donating to the board... 1. NT does not tell us HOW. 2. In Loco Parentis: Original home destroyed; needy children; donate to board (new home) Board = parents; 1 Tim.5:8 Catholic / Baptist Board? • NT: saints, not 'homes'

Contribution: twofold effect – 1) relieve needy saints

Lenski, 2 Co.9:13

"Secondly, the saints are seen as glorifying God 'also for the singlemindedness of (your) fellowship with them and with all,' i.e., all other saints... It is this fellowship of the Corinthians which extends not only to those saints who are being helped at present but to all God's saints, whether they are helped or not.
