  - If Jews had listened, would now believe gospel
  - Heaven AND gospel reach ends of earth. Every synagogue filled...

- God has spoken
- We communicate with those we love
  - Jn.3:16 . . . 14:9

## Without Bible, we know little about ourselves

- 1. Our origin, Gn.1:26-27 (Col.3:10)
- 2. Our objective, Is.43:7 (Col.1:16)
- 3. Our outcome: unknown without revelation, Ac.17; 1 Co.2; Ph.1:21-23

### Why do so many hate the Bible?

Reveals us as we are, not as we imagine

- 1. Evolutionary model pictures man ascending. Ec.7:29
- 2. Bible describes man as sinner.
  - Physical needs natural world supplies
  - Spiritual needs God supplies

### Why do so many hate the Bible?

Reveals us as we are, not as we imagine Our spiritual needs illustrated – Ro.3:10

- 1. The condition: sin, Ro.3:10, 23
- 2. The consequence: death, Ro.6:23
- 3. The cure: gospel, Ro.1:16
- 4. The cost: Jesus' blood, Ro.5:8-9
- 5. The condition: faith, Ro.3:25; 6:3-4

## 'But NT is only private letters . . . Not written to us'

- All know difference in private letter and 'epistolary' (literary) form used to convey public message.
- Ac.15:23-29; 16:4
- 1 Co.1:2, to Corinth
  - BUT: to be read by all
  - One pattern, all churches
    - 4:17; 7:17; 14:33. Col.4:16

## 4. To Produce Faith In Our Hearts

#### Romans 10:17

- Satan knows powerful effect of words on faith – Lk.8:12 (Gn.3)
- Words persuade nations . . .
- Words are powerful agents to change minds

### John 20:30-31

### Why does John write?

- 1. We know <u>Jesus</u> only by His revelation: Christ, God's Son
- 2. We know His <u>will</u> for us only by His revelation
- 3. His 'written' (2x) revelation produces faith

### John 20:30-31

### Why does John write?

- 4. He promises <u>everlasting life</u>: joy in heaven Mt.19:16-17, 21, 23, 29
- 5. John writes 'that' (2x) they will continue to believe (2x) [pres. tense] 1 Jn.2:19
- 6. Saving faith obeys: 2:23-24; 12:42-43 [Ro.10:10; Ac.2:44...]
