For we dare not class ourselves or compare ourselves with those who commend themselves. But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise.

 Especially important when seeing unfaithful congregations

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling

- Our salvation does not depend on our rank
- Individual salvation is not linked to our congregation
