Is the Bible flawed or is it free from all error?

- 1. If it contains mistakes, it cannot fulfill its intended purpose: convey will of God in trustworthy manner.
- 2. A mistake in one part implies possibility of mistakes in other parts.
- 3. If Bible is mixture of truth and error, how does it differ from other books?

 NT is not a geography book, but is accurate in every reference Inerrant: wholly true; w/o mistake; error free. Everything writers affirm is truthful and trustworthy.

John 10:35

Cannot be broken: annulled, shown to be in error, deprived of binding authority. Inerrant: wholly true; w/o mistake; error free. Everything writers affirm is truthful and trustworthy.

- Inerrancy applies to original copies of Scripture, NOT later copies
 - Hand-copy book of John . . .
 - 2 Sam.23:8
 - Bulletins
 - 1. We can discover original words.
 - 2. Copyists' errors do not affect doctrine.
 - 3. Virtually includes accurate translations.
