Jonah – A Type Of Christ

Book of Jonah

- Many think Jonah is fishy
- Integrity of Bible: includes book that depicts prophet negatively

I. Jonah: Unlikely Candidate For Type Of Christ

Jonah's life / work contrast with Lord's

- 1. Ran from duty, 1:3. Mt.26:46, 51-54
- 2. Believed / confessed truth, but disobeyed, 1:9. Hb.5:8
- 3. Did not still storm, 1:6-11. Mk.4:39
- 4. Endangered lives of others, 1:11. Jn.10:10
- 5. Sailors did not want his blood on their hands, 1:14. Mt.27:25
- 6. Needed second chance to do the job, 3:1-2. Jn.17:4; 19:30

Jonah's life / work contrast with Lord's

- 7. Obeyed God because of force, 3:1-4:2. Jn.5:30
- 8. Audience eagerly received his message, 3:1-10 (4). Jn.12:37
- 9. Wanted mercy for himself (2:9), not other sinners, 4:1-2. Jonah . . .
 - >Preferred death, not life of Nineveh
 - >Hated people he came to save
 - Watched city, hoping for destruction

Jonah's life / work contrast with Lord's

- 7. Obeyed God because of force, 3:1-4:2. Jn.5:30
- 8. Audience eagerly received his message, 3:1-10 (4). Jn.12:37
- 9. Wanted mercy for himself (2:9), not other sinners, 4:1-2. Jonah . . .
- 10. Warned people he hated, 4:1-11. Jn.1:11
- 11. Preached bad news; Nineveh repented. Mt.28, good news

Perhaps the only prophet as bad as Jonah: Balaam (Gentile)

NO type fully matches Jesus – He is unique. 1 Pt.2:22; Jn.8:46

Jesus makes Jonah His 'type' – Mt.12; Lk.11. I. Jonah: Unlikely Candidate...Type Of Christ

II. Jonah, A Type Of Christ

Must avoid overstating case Not every similarity is type-antitype Analogies – Both . . .

- 1. Slept during storm at sea, 1:5; Mk.4
- 2. Awakened by passengers, 1:6; Mk.4
- 3. Saved others by self-sacrifice, 1:11-16; Jn.12; Mk.10:45
- 4. Preached to great cities, 3:3; Mt.11
- 5. Preached repentance, judgment, 3:4; Mt.12; 24
- 6. Saved believers, 3:5-10; Lk.19:10

Type - Antitype Both in the 'deep' three days / nights Mt.12:38-41 -

- 38: <u>request</u>: sign. Insult: Jn.3:2; 12:37
 - 1. Blinded by sin, error.
 - 2. Showed many signs. 1 Co.1
 - 3. Walk by sight, not faith.
- 39: <u>response</u>: no sign except Jonah's
- 40: revelation: in heart of the earth
- 41: <u>reversal</u>: surprise ending at Jdgt.

Type - Antitype Both in the 'deep' three days / nights Lk.11:29-32 -

- 30: became sign to Nineveh so Jesus
 - 1. Acts 28, Paul: must be 'god'
 - 2. Jonah: rescued from fish
 - 3. Jesus: OT account is factual

<u>AS</u> . . . <u>SO</u>

- Sailors see Jonah swallowed by fish
- Spectators see Jesus crucified...
 - 1 Co.15. Lk.24:18...31

Type - Antitype Both in the 'deep' three days / nights Lk.11:29-32 -

- 30: became sign to Nineveh so Jesus
 - 1. Acts 28, Paul: must be 'god'
 - 2. Jonah: rescued from fish
 - 3. Jesus: OT account is fact.

BOTH were in deep (Mt.12:40) – hades (Jonah 2:2-3, 6). Jesus, Acts 2:27 BOTH were miraculously delivered, Jon.2:10. Jesus, Ac.2:24
