Luther on trial

- Luther: "councils cannot make something right that is not divine right..."
- Eck: "You attach more weight to one's own interpretations of Scripture than to that of popes and councils, the doctors & the universities? 'Are you the only one that knows anything? Except for you, is all the Church in error?" –Bainton, 90f.

God speaks to us by means of . . .

- 1. Direct statements (includes commands)
- 2. Approved examples
- 3. Forced conclusions

Direct statement Ac.15:15-17 Approved example Ac.15:7-11 Forced conclusion Ac.15:12 1808: man saw that human creeds were without authority and Scripture was all sufficient

- Proposed: 'Where the Bible speaks, we speak; where the Bible is silent, we are silent.'
- Reply: 'If we adopt that as a basis, then there is an end of infant baptism.

'Of course, if infant baptism be not found in the scriptures, we can have nothing to do with it.'
