- Pure: not mixed or adulterated with any other substance or material; freed of any contamination

Leviticus: focus included food, blood, leprosy, corpses...

Prevention, Disinfection, Purification

- Lv.12, child birth (Lk.2:22-24)
- Lv.14, cleansing leper
- Lv.16, sin
- Lv.18-20 (20:10)

Ceremonial cleansings taught Israel purity of heart.

"Cleanliness is next to godliness." Filth: fitting symbol of sin.

Psalms – Prophets Emphasis on moral purity
