- Love one another
- Selfishness leads us to forsake
- We all need encouragement

Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing. And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you

- Preachers / Elders needs encouragement too
- Both during and after sermon

Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers.

- How we discuss sermons afterwards

Unappreciation can cause us to grow weary

Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away. For if the word spoken through angels proved steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just reward, how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard Him

- We will receive our "reward" if we disobey
- Take Word of God seriously

But even to this day, when Moses is read, a veil lies on their heart. Nevertheless when one turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.

- Jews rejected Christ
- "minds were hardened (vs. 14)
- We cannot learn if we know everything

Therefore I speak to them in parables, because seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand. And in them the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled, which says: 'Hearing you will hear and shall not understand, And seeing you will see and not perceive; For the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, And their eyes they have closed, Lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, Lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, So that I should heal them."

 Hearing does us no good if we don't understand.

- Remember that men aren't perfect:

Now when Peter had come to Antioch, I withstood him to his face, because he was to be blamed; for before certain men came from James, he would eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he withdrew and separated himself, fearing those who were of the circumcision.

- Peter and Paul both made mistakes
- Mistakes aren't malicious
- Correct with love

- Remember that men aren't perfect:

As also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which untaught and unstable people twist to their own destruction, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures.

- Malicious twisting of the Scriptures
- We must all be on the watch
- Requires a good foundation

But there were also false prophets among the people, even as there will be false teachers among you, who will secretly bring in destructive heresies, even denying the Lord who bought them, and bring on themselves swift destruction. And many will follow their destructive ways, because of whom the way of truth will be blasphemed. By covetousness they will exploit you with deceptive words; for a long time their judgment has not been idle, and their destruction does not slumber.

- Nothing new
- Among us
- Terrible consequences

Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world.

- John loves the readers
- A test is required to discern false teaching

11. These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so.

- No harm comes from testing what is taught
- We either find false teaching or become better teachers

But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

- Just hearing does us no good
- The sermon should leave the building with us.
- Deceive ourselves into thinking we are doing something

- Teaching will convict us

- Making disciples takes more than knowledge
- Takes action on our part
