# Mary

#### Three fundamental tenets

- 1. Mary was mother of God
- 2. Remained perpetual virgin
- 3. Conceived, born, and lived without sin

Many unsubstantiated claims about Mary

## Biblical facts pertaining to Mary

1 Tim.2:5, ONE mediator: One who stands equidistant from two sides

Jesus lived with God in heaven, came to earth, Son of God (Jn.3:17) and Son of man (Mt.9:6).

Only He can qualify for this work.

Hb.7:25; 1 Jn.2:1.

# Biblical facts pertaining to Mary

Catholics use John 2 to imply Mary's intercession with Jesus

- a. 'Woman' (4). Not 'mother'
- b. Mild rebuke, not spiritual exaltation
  - 1) 'What have I to do...' [2 Sm.16:10]
  - 2) 'My hour has not yet come'
    - ► Mt.12:46-50
    - ► Lk.11:27-28
- c. Jn.14:6, THE way...
- d. Mt.13:55-56... brothers

### Saint worship

- Graves were more splendidly adorned and more frequently visited than palaces of kings
- 1. 1205: bishop Nivelon
- 2. Pope also received worship
  - "The Pope can do all things whatsoever he pleases, even unlawful things, and is more than God" – Cardinal Zabarelli
  - a. Saints = Christians: Ph.1:1; 1 Co.16:1; Ro.1:7
  - b. Lk.16, departed saints cannot act on behalf of people on earth
