Psalm 110

- Most quoted psalm in NT
- Psalm 110 proves . . .
 1. Davidic authorship, Mk.12:36-37
 2. Inspiration of God produced psalms, Mk.12:36. Godhead
 3. Perfect king: NOT David idealized, but one to come; more than man.

I. 1: N.T. Application

Mk.12:35-37, His DEITY: Lord

- 'My Lord': human AND divine
 - Son of David
 - David calls Him 'Lord' - (Lk.1:43)
- 'Right hand': Hb.1:3; Rv.3:21

Mk.12:35-37, His DEITY: Lord

Ac.2:33-38, His IDENTITY: Jesus

- 33: right hand = Ps.110.
- 34: cannot apply to David. Ps.110
- 35: audience realizes truth.
- 36: Christ AND Lord. Jn.20:28
- 37-38: name (authority).

Mk.12:35-37, His DEITY: Lord
Ac.2:33-38, His IDENTITY: Jesus

1 Co.15:...25, **His DOMINION: Victory**

- Proofs of His resurrection
- 25: quotes Ps.110
- 26-27, results – total victory.

1 Co.15:...25, His DOMINION: Victory

Hb.1:13, **His SUPERIORITY: angels**

- Jews superstitiously exalted angels
- “God is too far above man to approach; angels bridge the gap”
- Jesus is superior to angels

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- 5: Sonship (Deity)
- 6: Worship
- 7-9: Heirship (Mt.26:53)
- 10-12: Governorship (Mt.24:35)
- 13-14: Rulership (Lk.16:22; Ac.10)

II. 2: Characteristics of His
Rule: In Midst of Enemies

Jesus set up His kingdom

- NOT by destroying enemies
 - BUT letting them become servants
 - Many reject Him as . . .
 1. Prophet: prejudice against truth
 2. Priest: 'slaughterhouse religion'
 3. King: willful disobedience.
- Lk.6:46

Premillennial view: would rule in Utopia (abuse of Is.11)

- 'With all the evil in the world, He cannot be ruling now'
 1. God was ruling in OT ... in midst of His enemies
 2. Ps.110 perfectly describes our time

- Saints: 'Life is hard...' 1 Pt.1:6-7
