- God is Specialist Generalist

4: angels

Heavenly beings? Earthly messengers?

- "Sinned": Jd.6
 - Argues from greater to lesser
 - Sinful angels are not saved by . . .

Rank

Power

Privilege / Dignity

- "Cast them down to hell": confine in Tartarus
- "Reserved for judgment": keep, hold, preserve. Jd.6. Mt.8:29. 1 Pt.1:4.

5: ancient world

Sinners not protected by great numbers. "Surely this many can't be wrong!"

"You and your little group...?"

• "Did not spare": evil generation could not sin with impunity . . . even if almost all die.

Evil will be punished, even if only one family survives. Mt.7:13-14.

• "Bringing in flood on world of ungodly": irreverent, impious; living without regard for religious belief or practice.

6-9: Sodom and Gomorrah

Gn.13:10-11

"Abundance of earthly blessings are a sign of God's approval."

"It's my body; I can do what I want to do."

- "Turn to ashes": Dio Cassius
- "Condemned them to destruction": Guilty!
 - God condemns what many defend.
- "Making them an example":
 - "Let me give you a sample…"
 - Jd.7. Ro.9:29.

5: saved Noah

Through no fault of his own, surrounded by world of heathens; needed God's deliverance

- Remained faithful <u>surrounded by sinners</u>.
 1 Pt.3:20-21 . . . 4:1-4.
- Preacher of righteousness concerned about sinners.

6-9: delivered Lot

Through own fault (choices), surrounded by ungodly.

[Why choose to live in Sodom?]

- 7: God calls him "righteous" (3x).
- 7: He did not become indifferent to sin.
 - "Oppressed": distressed, with implication of being worn out by the experience.
 - Security: ability to be shocked at sin.
- 8: "grieved by sin": torture, distress, harass. Continual action.

6-9: delivered Lot

- 8: "grieved by sin": torture, distress, harass. Sin should 'always' torment us
 - 1. Sin in world: Gn.19:9
 - 2. Sin in church: 1 Co.5:1...2
 - 3. Sin in self: Mt.11:21-24
