- Dwell on; constantly think about [habit]
- Our greatest conflict: battle for the mind
- Ro.1:28, And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a debased mind, to do those things which are not fitting...

## Think these things

- Ph.3:15-16
  - Replace stinking thinking with good
  - Ro.12:2, And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

## What things?

- 1. True: honest (assumes knowledge). Ep.4:21
- 2. Noble: honorable, worthy, holy, above reproach (things of worthy character; produced by truth).
- 3. Just: right; lawful, Ep.4:24.
- 4. Pure: cf. 1:17.
- 5. Lovely: valuable, pleasing, attractive, beautiful.
- 6. Of good report: speaking well of. 2:19-30.
- 7. Virtue: 2 Pt.1:3, 5. Excellence; merit.
- 8. Praise: Ro.2:29.

## Pass judgment on every thought

If we surrender one thought, we...

- 1. Reflect badly on God. 2 Sm.12:14; Ro.2:24
- 2. Leave ourselves open to any evil.
- 3. Evil thoughts knock; don't let them in.
- 4 For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, 5 casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ 2 Co.10:4-5
