# Cambyses' army



## Glorious promise: Ezk.36:24-31

- 1: probably raised more questions
- 2: Israel: dead in Babylonian exile, no longer a nation (586 BC)
- 3: Chapter 37 foretells the impossible

# I. Background Summary

## Israel's predicament

- Spiritually, nationally dead; exiled (1-2)
  - Valley: bones (slain, v.9) a lost battle
  - Dry bones:
    - Disconnected
    - Scattered
- Ezekiel: take a good look (2)

Lord does not fear a close examination of His miracles

## God's power (3-6)

- "Can these bones live?" (3)
  - 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 14
- "You know"
- "Prophesy" (preach to bones??) (4)
  - Is.55:11
  - God specializes in the impossible" (5)
  - "Breath" (Spirit, 1; Gn.2:7)
  - "Will live" (5) . . . "Will know" (6)

## God's promises (7-10)

- 7: old, dry, loose bones
- 8: flesh on bone (valley of corpses)
- 9-10: prophesy to breath (or wind / spirit / Spirit) Gn.2:7

Stood upon their feet, a very large army

## 1. Bones (children of Israel, 11)

- Human wisdom.

Now they were forced to trust God, their only refuse

## 2. Ezekiel had to learn (12a)

• 2 Cor.1:...9

"Nothing is too big for my God to accomplish, and nothing is too little for Him to use in accomplishing it!"

# 3. Death is final, but God can do the impossible, 11-14

- Our bones are dry...our hope is lost, 11
- God still raises the dead (10, 12)
  - Joseph in Egypt
  - Israel vs. Egypt
  - Assyria against Israel, Is.10
  - Cyrus defeats Babylon, releases Israel, Is.45

- Messianic saves sinners, Ezk.36:26-27
  - Mt.3:9; Ep.2:5; 5:14
- Israel. Ezk.2-3
- Ac.2...4, killed Jesus, yet...
- Hb.7:25
  - Jairus' daughter, Mk.5
  - Widow's son, Lk.7
  - Lazarus, Jn.11
