- 27-28: these things?
 - -1-11: grand entrance
 - -15-17: cleansing
 - 18: authoritative teaching

Mark 1:21-22: Jesus taught with authority Jesus displayed authority, 23-27 Three years later, 11:27-33

- 27-28: these things?
 - -By what authority (28)
 - If He merely asserted for three years without proof, it would be a draw
 - Recognized need for authority (29)
 - Realized authority comes from one who has rightful power to grant it

Mark 1:21-22: Jesus taught with authority Jesus displayed authority, 23-27 Three years later, 11:27-33

- 27-28: these things?
- 29-30: only two sources of authority...
- 31-32: more concerned about what they say than what God said, and for consequences, not truth
- 33: plead ignorance we do not know

- Deut.4² You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you
- Changing the word prevents doing His will
 - -Acts 2:38
 - -Rom.3:28
- Attitude paved way for denominationalism
 - -"I believe in a kind God..."

- Prov.30⁶ Do not add to His words, Lest He rebuke you, and you be found a liar.
- Adding makes liars
 - Do not mix human dross with His gold
 - -Mt.15:2 . . . 4 . . . 6 . . . 7 . . . 9 . . .
 - Jesus exposed them as liars who do not keep His word.

- Jer.10²³ O Lord, I know the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps.
- We don't know what God wants unless He tells us
 - Not by stars, signs, omens, opinions, etc.

 Mt.28¹⁸ And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.

- Mt.28 if He had partial authority like a provincial governor, He might have sent them to part of the world
 - All authority (1 Co.15:24) . . . nothing can escape His jurisdiction.
 - -Has been given (Dn.7:13-14)
 - When God speaks, we listen

 Gal.1⁶ I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, 7 which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. 8 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed. 9 As we have said before, so now I say again, if anyone preaches any other gospel to you than what you have received, let him be accursed

- Gal.1 where angels fear to tread
 - Turning away: in process of deserting or transferring from one thing to another
 - -1 K.21:25

- Ph.3¹⁶ Nevertheless, to the degree that we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us be of the same mind
- Learning how to walk
 - Use the light we have; will give us more
 - -Jn.3:21, do truth, come to light

- Col.3¹⁷ And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him
- You are citizen of Colosse: what does verse 17 mean?
 - "Comprehensive":
 - personal conduct
 - public assemblies
 - private thoughts and deeds

World community of Christians

Any denomination professing same Christian creed, as Methodist Church

National religious body, as Church of England

In early Christianity, often means the worship of God by a group of Christians, as church in Antioch, Syria

Church

- "In common usage for several hundred years before the Christian era and was used to refer to an assembly of persons constituted by well-defined membership" L-N
- Acts 19:32, 39, 40, secular use
- OT (LXX): Dt.31:30
- Congregation of Christians, implying interacting membership – L-N
 - -Mt.-Jn.: church: 2 times. Acts: 19 times.
 - -NT: 115 times

Corinth

Acts 18:8

- 1 Co.1:2 ... 1 Co.5:2-5 ... 1 Co.11
- 1 Co.14:23
 - "I am a church of Christ"
 - "I am an assembly at Athens"?
 - "I am a denominational church"?
 - *1 Co.12:14, for the body is **not one** member but many
