Paul's Closing Arguments

(Galatians 6:1-18) (XI)

- Paul's differences with Judaizers and concern for the Galatians was not a minor matter. Eternal salvation was at stake.
- Has Paul said enough that he can close with a sweet appeal?
 - No he must use another sword thrust...
 - Paul makes a final point for their own good.
 (cf. 13)

I. Restore the Fallen, 1-10

- Brethren: nine times in this epistle. Ro.16
- If a man is overtaken (caught)...
 - Overpowered by satan before he knows what hit him. Noah, Gn.9
 - Christian can be overtaken by sin; caught up without warning. 1 Tim.6:9
- In any trespass (sin). Mt.6:14. 2 Sm.12. Gal.2:11-13

- You who are spiritual: 5:25
- Restore such a one: put in order, mend your ways. Restore to former condition. Mt.4:21.
- In spirit of gentleness (5:22): Not overly impressed by sense of one's self-importance. Humility.
 - One who accepts God's dealings without disputing – opposite of ¹arrogance, or ²harshness.
 - Lk.10, pour in oil / wine.
 - Gn.4:9, brother's keeper...? Gal.4:19-20

- Considering yourself:
 - May get caught up in same sin.
 - Paul answered Galatians' issues item by item without compromise.
- Lest you also be tempted. Ac.20:28

- Bear: v.5. Mt.22:12.
- One another's burdens: 2 Co.5:4. Ro.12:15.
- Fulfill law of Christ: 5:13-14. Ja.2:8.

- If anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself...:
 - Self-importance = self-ignorance. Lethal.
- "Too strong to fall. . ." "Too high to help. . ."
 "He needs no one . . ."
 - Ph.4:13
 - Lk.17:7-10
 - Lk.18:9-13
 - Dan.4:30

- But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another
 - Examine: prove; make a critical exam of something; put to the test.
 - Lk.14:19
 - 1 Co.11:28

- For each one shall bear his own load:
 - Contrast v.2, 4, 5.
 - Ac.27:10, 'Men, I perceive that this voyage will end with disaster and much loss, not only of the <u>cargo</u> and ship, but also of our lives.

- Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches
 - Instructor has good things; student receives them. The teacher has good things; the student participates in them and is enriched.
 - 1. Does Paul expect the Galatians to support him financially...?
 - 2. Does he expect them to support their Judaizing charlatans?

- Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap
 - Deceived: go astray, be deluged, mistaken.
 Mt.22:29
 - Mocked: turn up the nose at, treat with contempt.
 - Whatever a man sows...: Gn.8:22

- For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life
 - V.8 is the application to the law (v.7)
 - Mt.13:3ff., different sowers ... different soils
 - Ro.8:12-13
 - Sow to flesh: pander to it; ct. Ph.3:19
 - We reap either from harvest field of flesh, or of Spirit
 - Life either quantity (Mt.25:46) or quality

- And let us not grow weary while doing good –
 For in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart
 - Do not grow weary: lose enthusiasm, be discouraged.
 - Do not lose heart: 2 Th.3:13. Ja.5:7
 - Do not quit.

9: negative . . . 10: positive

- Therefore sums up 6-9
- Opportunity after reaping spiritually good things from our teachers, we share it with others
- Especially the Christian wants to teach everyone, but his special concern is for fellow Christians (household of faith).
- Paragraph: v.1, restore fallen. 2, bear others' burdens. 10, summary admonition

I. Restore the Fallen, 1-10

II. Remember the Cross, 11-18

- See with what large letters I have written to you with my own hand!
 - Because of age, injury, or emphasis (?) Paul writes this closing section in large letters.
 - We show emphasis with capitals, underlining, bold...
 - Common to employ a secretary, then conclude in own hand. 2 Th.3:17

- As many as desire to make a good showing in the flesh, these would compel you to be circumcised, only that they may not suffer persecution for the cross of Christ.
 - "We are doing more to spread Judaism than the most rigid Jews"
 - Cross: 5:11, 6:12, 14 (crucified: 6:14)
 - Galatians are influenced by Judaizers who want them to be circumcised so that they can avoid persecution

- For not even those who are circumcised keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may boast in your flesh
 - They do not keep the Law.
 - They use Galatians like notches on pistol...
 - They care nothing for the Galatians. Mt.23:4

- But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world
- There are three crosses in this chapter Paul boasts about the . . .
 - 1. Cross on which Christ died (6:12)
 - 2. Cross by which the world was crucified to Paul (6:14a)
 - 3. Cross by which Paul was crucified to the world (6:14b)

This cross was the . . .

- a. Manifestation of divine love, Jn.3:16
- b. Magnet that attracted him, Jn.12:32
- c. Means of his salvation, Jn.3:16
- d. Model for him to imitate, Ph.2:5-8

- For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but a new creation (2 Cor.5:17)
 - Parallels 5:6
 - Judaizers cannot offer anything that will save

- And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God
 - Walk: be in line with a person or thing considered as standard for one's conduct, hold to, agree with, follow, conform
 - Rule: standard; measuring rod.
 - We measure doctrine and life by Scripture.
 - Canon of NT God's standard

- And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God
 - Peace be on them no longer living in fear of God's wrath
 - Mercy God's compassion…desire to help
 - And upon Israel of God Ro.9:6

- And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God
 - Church is <u>Israel</u> of God (Jews / Gentiles who obey Him). 3:29
 - Church has a '<u>rule</u>' (standard) to give it direction.
 - Church enjoys <u>peace</u> and <u>mercy</u> if it walks by this rule

- From now on let no one trouble me, for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus
 - Three groups were branded: soldiers, slaves, devotees
 - Paul is Lord's soldier / slave / devotee
 - Galatians who see his marks (battle scars for Lord) should stand firm for truth as he does.
 2 Co.11:25

- Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen
 - Brethren: members of Father's family (Ep.3:14-15). Parting dig.
 - Exalted names
 - Lord: (Title of God in OT) Rule
 - Jesus: (Joshua of OT) Savior
 - Christ: (anointed one) Mediator, High Priest, Eternal king
 - Grace: don't part with it. [Ct. 3:10, cursed]
 Make your choice
