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- 3. Regarding clothing, the world has lost its mind!
  - a. While godly clothing is available, it takes effort to find it.
  - b. However, <u>much of what the world sells and wears is an</u> <u>abomination to God!</u>

## 4. The NT criteria for our clothing is MODEST

- a. 1 Tim 2:9-10: clothing that reflects good behavior, propriety (honorable, respectful), moderation (self-control), externally professing godliness (reverence) and good works
- b. 1 Peter 3:3-4: adornment of a godly character with an incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quite temperament
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# This was largely understood by the world up until relatively a few years ago.

- a. Modesty was the norm.
- b. Public immodesty was generally unheard of!

## 6. The 1960's brought in a new low for behavior!

- a. Regarding clothing, the invention of mini-clothes and popularization of the "flaunt it" mindset.
- b. From that point until now, the low has gotten lower!

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# 7. Today, society as degraded to unbelievable lows and to the point it cannot define:

- a. Male and Female
- b. Right and Wrong
- b. Modesty and Nakedness!

Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination?
No! They were not at all ashamed; Nor did they know how to blush. **Jeremiah 6:15**





## B. World's Usage - Law

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
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#### 3. This CANNOT be a RIGHTEOUS Definition! Gen 3:7-10

- TN law requires coverings that are <u>significantly less than Adam's</u> coverings
- Scholars: girdle covering the loins (Aprons, loincloths)
- Adam acknowledged (Vs 10) his coverings did not cover his nakedness!



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  - "gumnos" without clothing, ill clad, clad in undergarments only; metaphorical bare and open; forms of the word used ~18 times

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  - We know Modesty is beyond Nakedness...
  - BUT, if we do not know what Nakedness is...
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- **4. NO PROBLEM!** It is expected the NT reader understands the definition of Nakedness from the OT! Rom 15:4

## The Thighs...are nakedness

### **Isaiah 47:2**

- <sup>1</sup> Come down, and sit in the dust, O virgin daughter of Babylon, sit on the ground: there is no throne, O daughter of the Chaldeans: for thou shalt no more be called tender and delicate.
- <sup>2</sup> Take the millstones, and grind meal: uncover thy locks, <u>make</u> <u>bare the leg, uncover the thigh</u>, pass over the rivers. <sup>3</sup> <u>Thy</u> <u>nakedness shall be uncovered,</u> yea, thy shame shall be seen: I will take vengeance, and I will not meet thee as a man.

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How do we know nakedness is from the waist to the thigh?

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- Trousers cover nakedness
- Trousers reach from the waist to the thighs
- Nakedness is from the waist to the thighs.

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"And you shall make for them linen <u>trousers to cover their</u> <u>nakedness</u>; <u>they shall reach from the waist to the thighs</u>.

Trousers cover nakedness

A=B

Trousers reach from the waist to the thighs

A=C

Nakedness is from the waist to the thighs.

This is a common logical process

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- The purpose of the trousers is to cover their nakedness; their purpose is specified. To cover more or less would be unlawful! Therefore, there is no margin built in.
- Is it possible the following specifications have margin built in: Baptism, Faith, Repentance, or the Lord's Supper?

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  - Job 2:7 boils from the Sole to head,
  - Lev 13:12-13 leprosy head to feet,
  - Num 6:4 No grapes eaten seed to the skin,
  - 2 Sam 3:10 David's kingdom from Dan to Beersheba

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

### F. WATCH THE HEMLINES

- 1. Irrespective of garment or gender hemlines at the knee are only just covering nakedness!!
- 2. The standard for Christian clothing...MODESTY
- 3. Connie Adam, 1997 explains the problem....

### **Connie Adams....**

I want to say one more thing about Christians and shorts. Brethren often have pot lucks. I'm often hesitant about attending pot lucks in warm weather, because I know before I go that some of my brothers or some of my sisters will show up in attire which, so far as I am concerned, is immodest.

They often come in what's called "walking shorts." Those who wear walking shorts are fairly modest when they are standing up. But there is one thing about these walking shorts. Sooner or later, walkers get tired, and they have to sit down.

Then when they sit down at a picnic table, and they cross their legs, it all the sudden becomes a leg show. I'm calling it what it is. It's a leg show, and brethren didn't used to go to leg shows! Christians used to know the difference between right and wrong on this subject, but somehow, it seems we don't know the difference anymore.

## Conclusion

On average 12 people each year die at the Grand Canyon; many from falling from the edge!

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- Stay on designated trails and walkways and always <u>keep a safe</u> <u>distance</u> of at least six feet (2 m) <u>from the edge</u>.
- In areas where there is a railing or fence, do not climb over the barrier.
- Keep an eye on all of the people in your group, especially small children. Make sure that your travel companions have both feet firmly planted on pavement or developed trails at all times.
- <u>Know where the edge is</u>. Watch foot placement and <u>look for trip</u> <u>hazards</u>.
- Do not run, jump, or perform physical stunts when <u>near the rim</u>.
- Do not back up without first <u>looking where you are going</u>
