## I. Some Pursue in Wrong Way (Wrong Goals)

## 1. No purpose

One who is baptized has *arrived*? No! Mt.3:7-8 – why refuse them?

Pr.26:13-15

Ec.12:13-14

# 2. No purity

## 1 K.18:21

- Falter between two
- [waver...hesitate...]

No loyalty

No love of truth

No allegiance to God

### 3. No perseverance

Ezk.18:19-24

Valid principle everywhere

Lose health, money, marriage, soul... Wake up late?

## 4. No passion

Heart...enthusiasm Build, Lk.14:28-33 Unconditional surrender Disciples make no demands Jn.17:11-12 – the only one Jesus could not save

## 5. No precision

Ph.3:13, specific goals

"I hope to overcome all my weaknesses"

'Flat or round" . . . Ct. "one thing ... ."

- *Looking back* reveals a divided mind (Lk.17:32)
- *Looking back* leads to going back.
  Ex.14:15

Spiritual failure is . . . no purpose no purity no perseverance no passion no precision I. Some Pursue in Wrong Way

II. Some Pursue the Crown in Right Way (4:1)

- 1. Purpose, Ph.3:...7
  - "Gain": three times: 1:21; 3:7-8
- 2. Precision, Ph.3:8
  - Wordplay: loss of a loss is gain
  - Paul gained Savior (1:21)
  - "Loss": <u>three times</u>: 3:8-9
- 3. Principle, Ph.3:9, not righteousness of law
- 4. Perseverance, Ph.3:10, *know Him...* (1:21-23)

#### 5. Passion, 3:11-12

- 11, *if by any means possible...* 
  - Not pride
  - Not a done deal
  - Words used of sick child...
    - "If..." 11
    - Press on 12 /14
    - Chrysostom calls Paul an insatiable, greedy, devouring worshipper of God
    - Higher Ground

#### III. How to Press for the Prize?

1. Don't quit / think you have arrived, 3:12

- 1 Co.9:24, Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it.
  - Runner keeps eyes on prize
  - Runner presses hard till race is over
  - Mt.14, Peter

#### 2. Press for the prize, 3:12-14

- 12: press on to lay hold
  - 13: focus on without distraction
- 14: press toward the goal for the prize

## 2. Press for the prize – <u>How</u>?

- 1. Gratitude, 1:3-5
  - Based on joy / pardon, 4:4

#### 2. Brotherly love, 1:7-9. 4:1, 5

- Yielding, gentle, kind, mild, courteous, tolerant (with people, not sin)
- Is it in us?
  - Visitors?
  - Drivers?
  - Home?
  - Work?

- 3. Free of bitterness, 1:15-18
  - Ruth 1:20
  - How to react to criticism?
    - 1. Listen with open mind
    - 2. Examine self is it true???
    - 3. If untrue . . . forget it
    - 4. If true . . . be grateful, repent. 4:2-3

#### 4. Magnify Christ, 1:20

- Cause to be held in greater esteem
- Timing of statement: not Acts 9 on road or in city ...
  - After stripes, prison, shipwrecks

- 5. Service and sacrifice, 1:23-24
  - Better for Paul to leave...forever
  - Better for Philippians for Paul to stay
  - Impact on others, 2:25-30

#### 6. Avoid deception, 3:2-3

- Beware! Don't be deceived as Saul was
- Judaizers, not Gentiles, are dogs
- Gentiles, not Jews, are the circumcision

- 7. Avoid distractions, 3:13
  - This one thing I do
    - Past failures.
    - Past successes. 13 (4-7)
    - Present success. Leads to satisfaction

#### 8. Avoid impurity, 3:17-19

- Judaizers made laws (3:1-11)
- Libertines disregarded laws (3:17-19)

#### 9. Avoid compromise, 4:9 – do!

- Conviction costs
  - One another, Hb.10:24 stir up
  - Family time
  - Lost souls
  - Young people
